



#### **Diarrhoea and Vomiting**

We have been advised by UKHSA (UK Health Security Agency) to inform you that we have several cases of Diarrhoea and vomiting (gastroenteritis) in school. If you think that your child may be have developed this infection, please keep them off school until they are 48 hour symptom free. Please inform school immediately of any cases.

We have also got one confirmed case and two possible cases of Scarlet Fever. What is it?

Scarlet Fever is an infection due to a germ called Streptococcus.

#### What are the symptoms

Scarlet Fever often starts with a sore throat, high fever, swollen neck glands and tonsillitis. A skin rash develops on the body, and the face if often flushed. The tongue may be smooth and bright red.
