Inter Faith Week 2023 will take place from today Sunday 12 - to Sunday 19 November. It always begins on Remembrance Sunday, and runs until the following Sunday. It is hoped that the additional Sunday provides the opportunity for other weekend events to take place as well as those linked to Remembrance Sunday. Remembrance Sunday was chosen as a start day to encourage people to remember together the contributions of all faiths and none, and to consider how best to create a just, peaceful, and harmonious world. Inter Faith Week also ends on Mitzvah Day, an annual day of faith-based social action: The three aims of the week are:

- Strengthening good inter faith relations at all levels
- Increasing awareness of the different and distinct faith communities in the UK, in particular celebrating and building on the contribution which their members make to their neighbourhoods and to wider society
- Increasing understanding between people of religious and non-religious beliefs

This Wednesday is the feast day of **St Albert** the Great. Born in 1206, the eldest son of a powerful and wealthy German lord, he was educated in the liberal arts. Despite fierce family opposition, he entered the Dominican novitiate. A curious, honest, and diligent scholar, his boundless interests prompted him to write a compendium of all knowledge: natural science, logic, rhetoric, mathematics, astronomy, ethics, economics, politics, and metaphysics. His attempts to understand Aristotle's writings established the climate in which St Thomas Aguinas, whom he tutored, developed his synthesis of Greek wisdom and Christian theology. Named a Doctor of the Church, Albert is the patron saint of scientists and philosophers.
