Happy 50th Birthday, Outreach!

This year marks fifty years since the founding of our Parish Outreach group. We work with partners both at home and overseas, raising funds for projects with which members of the parish have some personal connection. Locally we support the work of ASCEND, a local employment programme for young adults; ASSIST which provides relief for asylum seekers; Ben's Centre; the Grace Food Bank; the Hallam Caring Service; Sheffield Samaritans; the SVP furniture store; St Wilfrid's; The Besom project; and Transport 17. Abroad we currently support partners in projects in Kenya, Zimbabwe, and Southern India, and the Bethlehem Carer and Hospice Trust.

Our three main fund-raising events each year are 'Coffee, Cakes and Cuttings' in the spring; 'Coffee, Cakes and Crafts' in November and the parish raffle. We also ask people to give their loose change every month via the Give to Live scheme, or Join the 100 Club- where you can both give, and have a chance of receiving, with monthly cash prizes!

We meet once a month on either a Monday or Tuesday evening, and any member of the parish is welcome to attend. Post pandemic, most of our meetings are via Zoom. Look out for details in the newsletter. We would love to welcome new friends and hear your ideas for the group- there is no age limit, and no need to attend every meeting or get involved in every activity.





A Reflection for the Second Sunday of Lent

The transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain, described in our Gospel reading today, took place shortly after Jesus announced his forthcoming passion to his disciples and explained their part in it. The transfiguration would confirm the faith of the apostles, who would witness Jesus's agony of fear in the Garden of Gethsemane, and his betrayal, torture and death by giving them a glimpse of what he will be in the future. His face, already threatened by death's shadow, is seen transformed in the great light of Easter. Moses and Elijah, the two great witnesses of the old covenant, testify by their presence to the inauguration of "the last days" and to the arrival of the great prophet so long awaited. God the Father is also present, and his voice reveals the secret of Jesus of Nazareth: "This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to

Soon it is time to come down from the mountain and continue in the footsteps of the Servant. Soon the darkness of Golgotha will obscure the brightness of the transfigured face. But that brightness was no fantasy; its vision was no dream. The dawn of Easter will reveal that life itself can rise from the dead. In today's first reading, Abraham is put to the ultimate test, and puts his faith in God. In the second reading, in his Letter to the Romans, St Paul writes, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" Like Jesus, like the apostles, like Abraham, like St Paul, let us put our faith in God and put that faith into action in our lives.

This Friday, 1 March, is the Feast day of St David, the patron saint of Wales. We have very little reliable information about him. He was a priest, and later bishop, engaged in missionary work in the mid 500's. He founded many monasteries practising austere lifestyles, including one at Mynyw, now called St David's. As he lay dying in old age in the year 589, his last words to his monks and flock are recorded as: "Be joyful, brothers and sisters. Keep your faith, and do the little things that you have seen and heard with me."
