This Sunday the war has resumed and its effects are deeply felt by all in The Occupied Palestinian Territories. (OPT). Bethlehem sees no active conflict, yet the repercussions of war weighs heavily on its residents. The security lockdown means that hotels stand empty; café's, restaurants and tourist sites have all shuttered their doors resulting in employee layoffs and wide unemployment. They will remain unemployed until hostilities end and the lockdown is

lifted. This is not likely to be anytime soon. In these circumstances there has already begun an exodus of Christians in search of work, security and a better life. The sick and the elderly cannot leave. They must endure. In the midst of movement and travel constraints our dedicated nurses persist in their work of providing care and comfort to individuals in their own homes. These nurses, daily confront concerns for their personal safety as they attend the most critically ill.

As in previous years our Christmas tree stars and donations to the Christmas Crib will help them in their work.

The Gospel of Mark

The season of Advent marks the start of a new liturgical year. The Sunday Mass readings are arranged on a three-year cycle. Each year features a different Gospel -Matthew, Mark, or Luke. Readings from the Gospel of John are interspersed throughout all three years. Today we begin Cycle B of the Lectionary, which focuses on the Gospel of Mark.

A sometime companion of both St Peter and St Paul, scholars believe Mark's Gospel was written around the time of the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans in A.D. 70. Mark's audience was made up of Christians who were living in times of turmoil, conflict and persecution. It was reassuring for them to be reminded that Jesus had foretold such difficulties. Early Christian communities took courage from Jesus' warning to remain alert and watchful, and they found in his words a way to persevere through suffering.

This week and next week, our readings from Mark's Gospel look forward to the Lord's second coming, reminding us that Advent is about more than our preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas. It is also about preparing ourselves for Christ's return in glory at the end of time. Like the disciples and the faithful in Mark's community, we also must stay alert and watchful and be faithful to God through both good and difficult times.

Prayer for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception

Father, we rejoice in the privilege of Our Lady's Immaculate Conception, which preserved her from the stain of sin by the power of Christ's redeeming death, and prepared her to be the Mother Of God. Grant that through her prayers we ourselves may come to you, cleansed from all sin. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Saint Nicholas

This Wednesday, 6 December, is the feast day of **St Nicholas**. Both Eastern and Western Churches honour him, but, historically, we know only that Nicholas was a fourth-century bishop of Myra in Asia Minor. As with many of the saints, we are can perhaps best capture the relationship which Nicholas had with God through the stories told about him. The best-known concerns his charity towards a poor man who couldn't provide dowries for his three daughters. Nicholas secretly tossed a bag of gold through the poor man's window on three separate occasions. Over time, this legend evolved into the custom of gift-giving on the saint's feast.

Prayer for the First Sunday of Advent

Grant, almighty Father, that when Christ comes again we may go out to meet him bearing the harvest of good works achieved by your grace. We pray that he will receive us into the company of the saints and call us into the kingdom of heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. **Amen**
