Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has been a great week in school with lots of children living out our core values each day. The values of ready and respectful were mirrored in Sunday's Gospel story of the rich man and the poor man. The message, that we need to be ready to recognise how lucky we are and to share what we can with those in need, is lived out in school in a number of ways. One way we do this is through our commitment to our chosen charities, such as Grace Food Bank for which we are having a non-uniform day on 21st October. In assembly on Monday, we thought about how we are the rich man; our riches are worth more than those of the man in the story as ours are loving families, good friends and caring teachers. We talked about how we can share our riches by showing kindness to others.
